

In Response to the Call of the Resistance: Let the Days of Popular Rage Begin Against Genocide, Starvation, and U.S. Hegemony

"In response to the call issued by the leadership of the resistance in Palestine and in exile, and in light of the escalating Zionist massacres and the forced starvation of our people in the Gaza Strip, and in confrontation with aggressive U.S. positions—the Masar Badil, the Palestinian Alternative Revolutionary Path Movement, calls on all its organizations, supporters and comrades internationally to escalate confrontation and actively participate in organizing Days of Popular Rage in capitals and cities around the world. We call for actions to reject the genocide and affirm support for the steadfastness and heroic resistance of our people.

The U.S. positions expressed by war criminal Donald Trump, notably, blaming the resistance for the famine, reflect the core approach of the imperialist project that has supported the Zionist entity since its inception. These positions are a direct continuation of the policies of successive U.S. administrations, and also clearly expose the stance of the European Union, the official Arab regimes, and all the states complicit in the siege, killing, and starvation.

We in the Masar Badil affirm that the true response to these positions lies in expanding the scope of popular, political, media, and militant confrontation with the entire system of colonialism and Zionism. It also lies in escalating campaigns of boycott and political isolation of the Zionist entity, intensifying popular pressure to expel U.S. military bases, and supporting all forms of resistance in Palestine and the region.

Let the first week of August become Days of Rage everywhere—especially in North America and Europe.

We call upon the masses of our Palestinian people, the allies and supporters of the resistance, and all anticolonial forces around the world to raise their voices loud and clear, take to the streets, besiege Zionist embassies, and turn every public square and city into a point of direct confrontation, until the siege is broken and the aggression is ended. Black August

"Here at **Prison Radio** we reflect upon Black August, the legacy of political prisoners who have given their lives for Black Liberation, as we recognize August as a historically significant month of "injustice and divine justice." The first Black August commemoration occurred in 1979, just eight years after the murder of George Jackson in San Quentin. Both George and his brother Jonathan were murdered by the state during the month of August for their action, political inspiration, and commitment to Black liberation. Jonathan was just 17 when he was killed outside the Marin County Courthouse during his seizing of Judge Haley and 4 others, as he sought to pressure the state for the freedom of his brother and the Soledad Brothers (Fleeta Drumgo and John Clutchette, prisoners accused of murdering a prison guard at Soledad Prison).

Black August celebrates resistance and highlights repression of Black liberation revolutionaries. This legacy of resistance to state violence, this bloody path toward freedom, is the context of current liberation struggles. Prison Radio continues to amplify the voice of those targeted by the state and demands the release of all political prisoners. We seek to expose the nature and conditions of mass incarceration as part of a racial program of repression.

As Mumia Abu-Jamal tells us, Black August is a reminder of the history of Black struggle, from the early rebellions of Nat Turner, to the sacrifices of George and Jonathan Jackson, and a future of freedom not yet won. Prison Radio correspondent Peter "Pitt" Mukuria reminds us of Huey Newton's words which declared that George's "spirit became a living thing because his ideas lived." Black August celebrates the spirit of George Jackson and other revolutionaries' ideas by honoring the lineage of liberation. Today's self determination efforts are rooted in the work of those who came before.

Another Prison Radio correspondent Sheik Bilal Abdul Salaam-Bey says, "Black August is a time to embrace the principles of unity, self-sacrifice, political education, physical training, and resistance." Bilal suggests that those commemorating Black August must study four hours each day, emphasizing revolutionary texts, exercise daily, fast from sunup to sundown, and not listen to the radio or music. Bilal bridges a commemoration of the past by honoring past Black Freedom Fighters with the ongoing struggle against the state. These practices highlight the sacrifices made by the individual towards collective freedom from the oppressive state.

Peter "Pitt" Mukuria brings to mind George's favorite Franz Fanon quote: "the time for talking is ending. The time for action has begun." We at Prison Radio are moving into August with a deep appreciation and gratitude for those who chose action and, in many cases, sacrificed their lives and freedoms for the liberation of others. We are reminded now, more than ever, of the importance of action – of turning ideas into a movement towards a liberated future.

This month should serve as yet another reminder of the vital work that political prisoners are doing from the inside each and every day. At Prison Radio, we serve as a platform to uplift the voices of those who across the nation and continue the struggle for liberation that Black August represents -- a feat that we could not accomplish without your support. Community rallies around cafe owner targeted by DOJ

"What's it like to be a small Oakland cafe and end up in the crosshairs of the federal government? In June, just four months after President Donald Trump announced the creation of a Task Force to Combat Anti-Semitism,

the Justice Department filed suit against the Jerusalem Coffee House on Telegraph Avenue and its owner, claiming they had violated federal civil rights laws by discriminating against two Jewish customers. Today, before a phalanx of television cameras, the owner of that cafe, Abdulrahim Harara, made his first public remarks since the suit was filed — and used the moment to bring attention to the crisis in Gaza. "My heart is heavy with grief," Harara said in opening an emotional press conference behind the cafe. "Today we are witnessing, unfiltered, a colonial genocide unfolding in real time." "My words feel small in the shadow of lives lost, the children buried under the rubble, the decay of homes, memories buried under the weight of American bombs," he said. The National Lawyers Guild Stands in Support of the Prairieland Defendants Facing Unchecked Federal Repression

"On the night of July 4th, local police arrested 10 people outside the ICE Prairieland detention facility in Alvarado, Texas after a noise demonstration in solidarity with those being kidnapped and detained by the Trump administration. Since then, 6 more people have been arrested in connection with the case. We don't know all of the circumstances leading to the arrests. We do know that popular outrage and resistance to deportations is growing across the country. Organizers, activists, and affected communities have spent the year organizing rallies and protests outside of detention centers just like the one in Alvarado. The 16 people arrested currently face serious charges aimed not only at ruining their lives, but signaling an authoritarian criminalization of dissent and protest against ICE. Local authorities have set bail at \$10 million per person.

This is a fundraiser to raise at least \$50,000 in legal fees and living expenses for all those facing repression connected to the protest at the Prairieland Detention Center. Due to the serious nature of the charges, the majority of money raised will go towards legal fees. Those arrested have jobs, families, and rent that needs to be paid. As they remain incarcerated due to punitively high bail, some funds may be used to cover expenses like child support, rent, or other basic necessities. In the event that we raise funds beyond what defendants need as they go through the legal process, these excess funds will be used to support other Texans facing arrest and prosecution for organizing and protesting. The DFW Support Committee is a group of loved ones, friends and comrades of the defendants who are committed to supporting them through the legal process and have experience with legal support and anti-repression organizing. We will post regular updates about the case, the use of funds from this fundraiser and the specific support needs of the defendants here. The 55th Anniversary of the August 7th Marin County Courthouse Rebellion

"On August 7, 1970 – 50 years ago – Jonathan Peter Jackson, the 17-year old brother of George Jackson, brought 3 guns into the Marin County Hall of Justice, where Judge Haley was presiding over the trial of San Quentin prisoner James McClain. He drew weapons from his satchel, and with the assistance of McClain and 2 prisoners who were witnesses for McClain, Ruchell Magee and William A. Christmas, took Judge Haley, Deputy District Attorney Gary Thomas and 3 female jurors hostage. Upon exiting the courthouse, Jackson and the other kidnappers attempted to flee with the hostages in tow. Police and prison guards opened fire on the van Jackson was driving. At the end of the shootout, Jackson, Haley, McClain and Christmas were dead and McGee and Thomas were seriously injured. The kidnapping was meant as a tool to negotiate the freedom of the Soledad Brothers, 3 Black prisoners (George Jackson, Fleeta Drumgo, and John Clutchette) who were charged with the murder of a prison guard at Soledad Prison in California.

This moment, like so many others, represents one of the influential Black Liberation Movement events and asks us to further study historic strugglers – Angela Davis, George and Jonathan Jackson, The Soledad Brothers, The San Quentin Six, Ruchell Magee, and organizations like the Black Panther Party. Our lessons must include prison resistance, political prisoners, state violence, and insurgency. Below we have compiled audio, video, and paper documents from a diversity of primary resources (most taken from the Freedom Archives but also from other online sources) illuminating the historical context and lasting significance of extrajudicial struggle.



In the Spirit of Black August We Recognize Our Movement Roots



"Greetings! We are nearing the end of Black August, the annual tradition that honors the work and sacrifice of Black freedom fighters and political prisoners who gave their all for Black liberation. At ALC, we pay special homage this month, and every month, to Russell Maroon Shoatz, the chief architect of our movement in Pennsylvania. As we await the PA Supreme Court's decision in Commonwealth v.

<u>Derek Lee</u>, the case we argued before the Court in October 2024, we remember that the roots of the fight to end death by incarceration began over four decades ago. It was then that Maroon began organizing lifers to get their families and community members politically engaged to lobby the PA legislature. For his efforts and success in organizing incarcerated people, <u>Maroon was thrown in solitary confinement</u> in spring 1983, where he would spend the next 30 years.

Standing on the precipice of a decision that could potentially win freedom for thousands of Pennsylvanians and impact thousands more, we are reminded of the tremendous sacrifices of Russell Maroon Shoatz and other freedom fighters who paved the way.

When asked about the most meaningful ways to commemorate Black August, Jihad Abdulmumit, former political prisoner, ALC Board Member and chairperson of the National Jericho Movement, encouraged us to support political prisoners by sending letters and commissary, joining campaigns to win their freedom, and picking up the torch to continue the work of liberation by getting involved in the movement. As the month comes to a close, we are inspired to continue this work with the same fearlessness and commitment as the political prisoners and freedom fighters who sacrificed for us all. 

"The following is an excerpt of Safiya Bukhari's *The War Before: The True Life Story of Becoming a Black Panther, Keeping the Faith in Prison & Fighting For Those Left Behind*. This section is titled "Enemies and Friends: Resolving Contradictions" and it was written sometime in the late 1980s or early 1990s, during a time when those who had been targeted by COINTELPRO were trying to recover their relationships and figure out how they would be able to continue to do political work together. This essay is one of Safiya's many attempts to contribute to that process, to examine what she sees as her own weaknesses in working with others, and to establish some firm foundation for encouraging people to unite to support the comrades left in prison. Since one of those people, Geronimo Pratt (Geronimo ji Jaga), had been unable to prove his innocence partly because of the rancor among some former Panthers, these questions had particular significance for Safiya's work.

Enemies and Friends: Resolving Contradictions

Over the past several years, the movement—or what is left of it—has been bogged down in a quagmire of infighting, backstabbing, manipulation, and one upmanship. Those of us in the movement don't see it this way. But to the people outside looking in—those we are attempting to organize—this is what appears to be happening. We see ourselves as being involved in concrete political work. De-pending on what political formation we belong to, we consider ourselves the sole standard bearers of revolutionary principles, the ones with the correct path—and everyone else who is not down with us is incorrect, fools, or napes. If we were able to take a step back to look at the situation objectively, we would get a different view.

The first thing that you recognize from that perspective is that there's a big world out there and the "movement" is very small. Not only is the movement small, but it's an extremely incestuous bunch of people. I don't mean that blood relatives are actually indulging in sexual relations. I mean that the movement is so small that it is hard to find someone who has not been party to a relationship— political or sexual—with someone else in the movement. In effect, we're all connected to one another in some convoluted way. In a very concrete sense, the movement has

become like Peyton Place or any other soap opera you see on television. Contradictions between people and organizations usually develop out of personal problems that escalate into political differences. Because the movement is rife with disorganization and lacks cohesion, people make decisions about whom to work with based on personal relationships. As a result, one might wonder whether we can be taken seriously when we talk about making a revolution in this country. I cannot exclude myself from this criticism, because I've found myself deciding on occasion to take the easy way out rather than stay and wage struggle to combat these tendencies and build a stronger movement.

My own inability to confront the problems and struggle to eradicate counterproductive tendencies within our formations stems from a fear of having my motives misconstrued or of being subject to personal attack. Sometimes it's extremely hard to deal with situations in a principled manner when people call one another "comrade" but treat each other in a manner that belies the use of that term. Social practice is the criterion for truth. If you talk about people behind their backs, have hidden agendas, or manipulate situations so that certain people are not privy to what's going on—and I'm not talking about a "need-to-know" situation—it makes it hard for people to criticize such activity without fearing retaliation.

The real problem begins with what Mao Tse-tung called liberalism.

In "Combat Liberalism," Mao Tse-tung said, "Liberalism is extremely harmful in a revolutionary collective. It is a corrosive that eats away unity, undermines cohesion, causes apathy and creates dissension. It robs the revolutionary ranks of compact organization and strict discipline, prevents policies from being carried through and alienates the Party organizations from the masses which the Party leads. It is an extremely bad tendency."

I have read and studied "Combat Liberalism" more times than you can shake a stick at. But reading doesn't necessarily mean understanding—and understanding doesn't necessarily mean internalizing. Within the past few months, I have been taking stock of myself and trying to understand what is making it hard for me to make real progress, to engage in constructive criticism and open myself up to criticism and self-criticism. It wasn't until the past few weeks, when I was trying to determine whether it made sense to continue to try and work with certain people, that I had to look into myself and recognize that I was again refusing to engage in constructive criticism. I was walking away and allowing a situation to continue without struggling to resolve contradictions. I asked myself, "How can you talk about taking on the United States government when you are afraid to struggle with a few people?" That is the biggest contradiction of them all.

Now, for the first time, I understand what Mao Tse-tung meant when, in a speech before the Chinese Communist Party's National Conference on Propaganda Work on March 12, 1957, he said, "He who is not afraid of death by a thousand cuts dares to unhorse the emperor." Whatever is unprincipled, incorrect, and counterproductive about you and your style of work, you have to be willing to subject to the rapier knife of revolutionary criticism if you are serious about creating a revolution. Everything—action or inaction, the way you relate to people you work with, how you deal with the masses, how you deal with your family, how you deal with personal relationships, how you deal with people with whom you disagree— has to be open to criticism and self-criticism. None of us is perfect, but we all claim to want to create a revolution. In order to create this revolution we must be willing to sublimate our egos for the good of the movement and suffer death of these egos by a thousand cuts. It is only when we are able to do this that we will truly be able to move forward and create a revolution—and win.

If we continue to practice liberalism and do not engage in struggle against incorrect views for the

sake of unity or progress or "getting the work done properly," then we will continue to walk away from organizations and groups, creating new groups of two or thirty. This practice has permeated the movement and helped to create the sectarian problem we're experiencing today. We cannot organize our communities for revolution if we cannot resolve the contradictions among ourselves. It's not good enough to say, "We agree to disagree." That usually means that you've decided to go your separate ways and not interfere with each other. If a contradiction is of such magnitude that you cannot work together, even with the knowledge that you're involved in building a revolution—something that requires a coordinated effort between revolutionaries and the masses, something that is highly life threatening—then you cannot just go your separate ways. There is no separate way in a revolutionary struggle. We're all either in this together or we're working at odds with each other. The sooner we recognize this and begin seriously working to resolve the contradictions among us, the sooner we can seriously begin to build a foundation for revolution.

To simply say that we're going to work together is not enough, either. We're all human beings. We all have our own idiosyncrasies. What is necessary is that we stop the liberalism, place all our cards on the table, and hash out our differences. We can no longer afford the luxury of rumormongering, making unsubstantiated allegations, or harboring ill feelings without airing them. The original split within the Black Panther Party in 1971 went down because we practiced liberalism, harbored ill will, believed rumors without investigation, and allowed this to go on until it grew so large that we believed the only way out was fratricide. If we had nipped it in the bud, COINTELPRO would not have been able to do its job. A lot of comrades would not have been killed, many more would not have ended up in prison for all these years, and countless others would not be members of the class of the walking dead.

Only when we lay all our cards on the table, reveal all our heretofore hidden agendas, and determine that we are working on the same agenda will we be capable of waging struggle over disagreements to build a strong, solid organization that will lead us to freedom and liberation. In understanding this, I have come to recognize that everybody does not take this view. For those who do, I would like to offer this view of how to resolve contradictions among the people so we can begin to move forward in the struggle. The first step is to discuss our goals and see whether they are the same, or at least whether they fit with one another.

We often assume that because we all say, "We're involved in a struggle," we mean we're involved in the same struggle, with the same objectives and goals. Here's what I mean by that phrase: I believe that nothing short of a revolution will eradicate the racism, capitalism, and imperialism that oppress me and my people as well as other exploited and oppressed people everywhere. I believe that the capitalist system of this country has to be destroyed and replaced with an economic system built on the premise "From each according to his ability, to each according to his needs." That is, every man, woman, and child contributes to the whole what he or she is capable of contributing, and, whether that contribution is highly skilled labor or unskilled labor, each receives from the whole the basic necessities of life—what is necessary for maintaining a humane and dignified existence. Once we have established a commonality of goals, the method we use in resolving contradictions should be determined by a number of factors, chiefly, (1) whether the contradiction is with our enemy or between friends and, (2) what is the desired outcome of the contradiction.

Once it has been established that the contradiction is between friends (for the purpose of this paper, "friends" is not being used to mean cut buddy, homey, or pal. Here it is merely a way of saying that the person is not an agent, pig, provocateur, or someone working against the interest

of the people), then the next step is to determine what the desired outcome is. If the contradiction is between friends, then the desired outcome must be to resolve the contradiction in order to move forward. If the allegation is that the person is an agent or enemy of the people, the desired outcome is to resolve the contradiction in order to verify the charge or exonerate the individual. The method used to resolve the contradiction starts from the premise "No investigation, no right to speak."

The first order of business is to investigate the allegation. Not to spread rumors or vilify the person, but to conduct a thorough, objective investigation of the circumstances that led to the charge. Too often in our movement, as in our everyday lives, we hear rumors about individuals and, without thought for consequences or making any effort to determine the validity of the rumor, we simply pass them on to someone else. On the streets, outside political formations, we're very clear that when we do this we're indulging in gossip. Within the movement, we talk about COINTELPRO all the time but don't realize that what we're doing is continuing the pattern of behavior that allowed COINTELPRO to succeed.

The object of investigation is to get to the truth. This requires that we enter into the investigation from the point of neutrality. This can best be done by empowering a minimum of three people to conduct the investigation and arrive at an objective conclusion. We must be objective and give no greater validity to one side than to the other. The axiom is that there are three sides to a situation: side one, side two, and the truth. In getting to the truth we must hear all sides of the question first. Once all sides are heard, if the truth is not easily discerned, then it becomes necessary to continue the investigation by questioning witnesses to the situation. During the course of the investigation, depending upon the nature of the charge, we conduct business as usual. The movement has long talked about people being "tried before the people in a people's court." But the theory has far outweighed the practice. The Provisional Government of the Republic of New Afrika (PG-RNA) has gone so far as to elect judges to its People's Court. But trying issues of dispute before a People's Court is not a working practice. In order for it to be a working practice, we have to begin implementing it. If we are to educate our people on the correct method of resolving contradictions by example, then we can ill afford to continue making allegations, spreading and embellishing them without moving to resolve them.

A Model for a People's Court

I recently engaged in such a dispute. The model that was used to resolve the dispute was a people's tribunal. The person bringing the charges put them on paper. The person the charges were brought against prepared a written response. These were disseminated to all parties involved. A date, time, and place were set for a hearing. Both sides were able to have witnesses present. Three independent hearing officers (having no involvement in the dispute and trusted by both sides) were chosen, and an odd number of (not less than five) jurists were chosen, also with no involvement in the charges. The hearing officers set the tone and laid out guidelines for the proceeding. The charges were read into the record and tape-recorded. Then the person bringing the charges presented her point of view, followed by the reading of the written response to the charges. Next, the person bringing the charges called and questioned her witnesses. The person charged then questioned the witnesses, followed by questions from the hearing officers and jury panel. The witnesses were not allowed to ask any questions; their part in the proceeding was simply to be witnesses. The proceedings were handled the same way for the person being charged when she presented her witnesses. All the parties involved had agreed to abide by the decision of the court, and they did. This is only a model. It was not perfect, and it is possible that the resolution was accepted and the episode laid to rest for reasons other than

the fact that the proceedings were handled in a principled manner.

Maybe We Really Haven't Identified the True Contradictions?

I suggest that the real contradiction may be that we really are not about the same thing, the same goals, and some of us are not willing to admit it. Not yet, anyway ...

Former Political Prisoner Of War Laura Whitehorn Stated:

"Safiya lived her politics, exuded solidarity from every pore and in every fiber of her being. She acted on her beliefs—and she was constantly questioning, refining and developing those beliefs. When you read her book, you will see that fighting for justice was a necessity to her. Resolving the inequitable, brutal situation of Black people and other oppressed groups was her bone-deep desire. She spent every ounce of her being trying to figure out how to proceed, evaluating past actions, pushing others to revitalize dormant work and struggles. And she loved her comrades behind bars in the most revolutionary way—by refusing to let them be forgotten. She took all political exhortations very personally, trying to apply them in practice, and trying to submit them to scrutiny and honesty, to bring them from the realm of the bullhorn to the arena of what you do when you get up every day. Safiya was not just a revolutionary during the revolutionary times of the 60s and 70s. She struggled to live as a revolutionary woman during the non-revolutionary times that followed and persist. Cop City Defendant has Domestic Terrorism Charge Dropped



"Atlanta, GA – Jamie Marsicano, one of dozens of defendants embroiled in the sprawling legal backlash brought against opponents of "Cop City," had a state-level Domestic Terrorism charge dropped in DeKalb County on Thursday. The dismissal represents the latest in a series of legal setbacks for the state as it moves forward with its expansive effort to prosecute those who mobilized to stop Cop City, a massive police training compound south of metro Atlanta in the South River Forest. More than 29

months after Jamie was arrested and charged under Georgia's domestic terrorism statute for their participation in the movement against Cop City, the state hadn't brought an indictment against the North Carolina resident, leaving them in limbo as they waited for a decision from the court regarding their charge and potential trial.

In a <u>ruling</u> issued August 14, Judge Gregory Adams determined the pending charge had disrupted Jamie's life to the point that their due process rights had been violated. Further, Adams agreed with the defense's argument that the state was delaying Jamie's indictment in order to get a tactical advantage in the ongoing Racketeering Influenced Criminal Organization (RICO) case unfolding in neighboring Fulton County. The court also found that Marsicano's right to a speedy trial had been violated.

"Of course, we're relieved and uplifted that the judge came to the right decision," Xavier T. de Janon, Marsicano's attorney, told Unicorn Riot after the ruling came down.

Marsicano was arrested at the South River Music Festival near Atlanta on March 5, 2023. They traveled to join the event, which was organized as part of a week of action against the Atlanta Public Safety Training Center, known popularly as Cop City, while on spring break in their second year of law school.


The festival, put on in the weeks after police killed Manuel "Tortuguita" Terán while they camped in the woods to oppose Cop City, was meant to rally the movement against the facility and bring people together in the aftermath of Tortuguita's killing. On the second day of the festival, a militant action against a Cop City construction site took place about three-quarters of a mile from the musical event. Hours later, police from multiple agencies raided the music festival and arrested 35 people. Marsicano was charged along with 22 others under Georgia's Domestic Terrorism law on March 6. Jamie was later indicted as one of 61 people the state is accusing of having participated in what it describes as a far-reaching criminal conspiracy to stop the \$118 million police training facility. In the years since their arrest, Marsicano had twice petitioned the court for a speedy trial – once in March 2024 and again in May 2025. Despite this, the state didn't indict Marsicano on the domestic terrorism charge, citing an ongoing investigation. Marsicano's lawyer filed a motion in June to have the domestic terrorism charge dismissed on the grounds that the slow process had violated Marsicano's right to due process and their right to a speedy trial. On August 6, Judge Gregory Adams heard arguments from the defense and the prosecution. At the hearing, the defense successfully argued that Marsicano's domestic terrorism charge had unduly impacted their life..." For full article see: unicornriot.ninja





"A history of the "Virgin Island Five", a group of activists accused of murdering eight people in the U.S. Virgin Islands. The murders took place during a turbulent period of rebellion on the Islands. The island was put under virtual martial law, and eventually five men: Ismail Ali, Warren (Aziz) Ballantine, Meral (Malik) Smith,

Raphael (Kwesi) Joseph, and Hanif Shabazz Bey were apprehended and then charged with the attack. All the men were known supporters of the Virgin Island independence movement. The five were charged after being subjected to vicious torture, in order to extract confessions. They were beaten, hung from their feet and necks from trees, subject to electric shocks with "cattle prods", had plastic bags tied over their heads and had water forced up their noses by the "defenders of the law." The judge (Warren Young) overlooking the case prior to being placed on the federal bench worked as Rockefeller's private attorney and even handled legal matters for the Fountain Valley Golf Course. Eventually, the five went to trial in what became known as the "Fountain Valley" murder trial. This was an obvious Kangaroo Court and a mockery of any sense of a fair trial. On August 13, 1973, each of the five men convicted and sentenced to eight (8) consecutive life terms..."

"Kojo Bomani Sababu is a New Afrikan Prisoner of War. He entered the carceral system at age 22, along with anarchist Ojore Lutalo, following a bank expropriation, death of neighborhood drug dealer and actions with the Black Liberation Army, resulting in a 55-year sentence.

Kojo was charged with conspiracy to escape Federal Prison at Leavenworth with Jaime Delgado (veteran independence leader), Dora Garcia (prominent community activist) and Puerto Rican Prisoner of War, Independentista Oscar Lopez Rivera, and which alleged plan included rockets, hand grenades and a helicopter. Born in 1953, Kojo's childhood brought early tragedy when his father died coming home from work in 1962, and again two years later when his mother was murdered – a double devastation on a young boy. His mother's influence and guiding presence in his life held fast as "he continued to live out the lesson she taught him, that education is a tool with which to change society." – newafrikan77

"... we must make great strides, reorganizing ourselves to embrace the difficulties we face. I have no solutions but I will say this: There are some great political minds contained in America's prisons, which are growing old as their era of life departs, this resource needs to be tapped before it expires. Do not abandon the political prisoners and POW s, they are still insightful with their knowledge and experience."

URGENT PUBLIC MEDICAL ALERTTHURSDAY, AUGUST 21, 2025 Mumia's eyesight is deteriorating at an alarming rate.

"An independent expert ophthalmologist has confirmed the progression of his eye disease by analyzing Mumia's most recent eye exams. She reports that he needs surgery and medically necessary treatment "immediately" or faces the possibility of "permanent blindness." Mumia's vision has plummeted from 20/30 with glasses in 2024 (near normal) to 20/200 today—legally blind—because the **Pennsylvania Department of Corrections (PA DOC)** failed to adequately monitor his vision and delayed his urgently necessary medical treatment and surgery. The PA DOC has known since at least March of 2025 that Mumia needed eye surgery. Exams from 2024 – 2025 showed a sharp deterioration, demanding immediate intervention. Despite knowing the urgency, they waited until July to act and then pushed surgery off to an unspecified date in September. Mumia believes he now suffers from "diabetic retinopathy" stemming from a diabetic coma that he endured after being given an improper and unmonitored dose of steroids for a skin disease in 2015. Mumia asserts that the PA DOC is "slow-walking [him] to blindness" in 2025 – another egregious case of the prison's medical neglect, medical harm, and inability to treat Mumia's medical needs.

Court records already document this pattern: (a) negligence in monitoring lab reports that led to the diabetic coma, and (b) deliberate denial and delay of his hepatitis C treatment that left him with cirrhosis."

"What Is a Political Prisoner?

Political Prisoners are people jailed on charges related to their resistance to oppression, targeted by the state for their political beliefs and/or actions. They are not imprisoned for actual crimes but for challenging a system built on invalid, racist laws designed to silence revolutionary efforts.

The Importance of Letter Writing

Letter writing matters because it ensures our comrades are not forgotten. Movement work must stay connected with incarcerated folk who have been at the forefront of every struggle. While infographics raise awareness, a handwritten letter or message makes an immeasurable difference. By writing, we defy the state's goal of making revolutionaries disappear. Every letter is a tangible act of resistance—a declaration that the movement will always be with our comrades, whether they are behind bars or on the frontlines of the revolution.

Our Incarcerated Comrades

Kamau Sadiki-Kamau Sadiki is a Muslim, a loving father of two daughters, a grandfather of five, and a veteran of the Black Panther Party. Joining the Party at the age of 16 in Queens, NYC, he dedicated his life to

his community before being arrested on trumped-up charges. Now, serving Life + 10 years, Kamau endures severe prison medical neglect. Every letter we write is a reminder that his struggle is not forgotten.

Rodney Hinton Jr.-After the brutal killing of his young son Ryan—shot in the back by Cincinnati police—Rodney now faces charges for a response born of deep grief and rage. His continued incarceration, held without bail, exposes a system that silences dissent and punishes the very act of grieving.

Jaia Cruz-A trans woman of color from New York City, Jaia Cruz has long faced hate violence and harassment. After a vicious beating on the streets and an altercation in a Harlem deli in January 2025—during which she defended herself by stabbing her attacker—she now endures a 15-year sentence. Criminalized merely for protecting herself in broad daylight, her case is a powerful indictment of a system that devalues the lives of trans and Black people.

Elias Rodriguez-Elias Rodriguez's targeted attack on two zionist diplomatic staff in May 2025 was a direct act of resistance against a zionist state perpetrating a genocidal campaign in Gaza. After nearly 2 years of relentless violence and legal repression, his act was a resounding declaration of "ENOUGH!" His struggle demands our international solidarity, challenging state violence both here at home and abroad.

Rev. Joy Powell-A dedicated pastor and community activist against police brutality, Rev. Joy Powell was warned by authorities that she was a target for speaking out against corruption. Convicted on charges of 1st Degree Burglary and Assault, she has now spent 16 years behind bars. Even in incarceration, her commitment to uplifting marginalized communities—especially incarcerated women—ignites hope and fuels our fight for justice.

Tarek Bazrouk-Tarek Bazrouk is a 20-year-old Palestinian student from New York City, targeted by the United States government for his activism. His family's home was unjustly raided by the FBI in May 2025, and he was later arrested and denied bail on the absurd claim that he is a "danger to the community." Now confined at the notorious and inhumane Metropolitan Detention Center in Brooklyn, his struggle is a stark reminder of the extreme measures used to silence dissent.

Jakhi McCray-Jakhi McCray is facing federal charges for allegedly setting fire to 10 police vehicles of the 83rd Precinct in Brooklyn in June 2025. He turned himself in on July 21, 2025, and was released the following day in a small but significant win for the movement. Now awaiting trial under house arrest, Jakhi's case underscores the high stakes of resistance and the price many pay for challenging state power.

Black August in The Bronx-Our communities are hyper-surveilled yet intentionally under-resourced. Elected officials routinely neglect our infrastructure—sold out to luxury real estate developers and guarded by so-called "law enforcement," the empire's foot soldiers trained to suppress people's rebellions. We have witnessed extrajudicial executions of Bronxites like Saniyah Cheatham, Eleanor Bumpurs, Kawaski Trawick, Ramarley Graham, and Deborah Danner—among the many massacred by the New York Pig Department. Black August signifies organizing material actions to break off the chains of colonialism, imperialism, capitalism, and white supremacy. It is a month of honoring our martyrs, fighting to free our prisoners, and dismantling all forms of carceralism in this prison house of nations. It is an international struggle—linking the fight here in the Bronx with battles in Swaziland, Palestine, Haiti, Atlanta, and beyond. All political prisoners, whether abroad or inside the imperial core, share the same fight.

BLACK AUGUST – Letter Writing for Our Brave Political Prisoners-Take the time to write a genuine letter to our brave political prisoners. Speak directly to our incarcerated comrades—ask about their day, share your struggle, and remind them that the movement will always stand with them. When we write, we resist the enforced absence and silence imposed by the state. Through our letters, we work to free all political prisoners and dismantle the systems of state oppression. Together, our pens become tools of liberation—and together, we reclaim our power." Source: Email.








M4BL: Commemorating Black August 2025

WHAT WAS THE INSPIRATION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THIS PLATFORM?

"The prisoners in Turkey started a period of action in the middle of 2000, in order to oppose the transition plan into isolation cells, which created a big sensibility in Turkey. In October 2000 the political prisoners in Turkey started a hunger strike. This resistance, which was later turned into a death fast, both created influence in the public and was supported by large sections of the people. For a certain period there was also support from Europe, the homeland of the isolation policy.

The isolation policy, which determined the agenda of Turkey and the Big Resistance (the 'death fast') created a certain consciousness about the effects of isolation on a person.

But in the same time this brought political instability for a Turkey, which was on its way to Europe.

The regime in Turkey also took support of European countries in the name of political stability and it started an attack against the political prisoners in 20 prisons, which ended in a massacre on 19th December 2000.

This military assault lasted exactly four days and happened before the eyes of the whole world. Finally, it ended on 22nd December with the 'victory' of the state.

The balance was frightening: 6 female prisoners at Bayrampasa prison were burned alive. There were killed in total 28 prisoners with bullets, in the fire, or by being beaten to death with truncheons.

Without exception, all political prisoners were tortured, hundreds of them were wounded and confronted with abuse or rape before their transfer to the new opened F-type isolation prisons..." For full article see:

'Global Day of Solidarity' - Hamas Calls for Global Mobilization on Sunday for Gaza Aug 3



"Hamas has called for a worldwide popular mobilization this coming Sunday, August 3, designating it a Global Day of Solidarity with Gaza, Jerusalem, Al-Aqsa Mosque, and Palestinian prisoners.

The Islamic Resistance Movement, Hamas, on Tuesday called for escalating global popular action this coming Sunday, August 3. This is to show solidarity with Gaza, Jerusalem, Al-Aqsa Mosque, and Palestinian prisoners. Hamas, in a statement, stressed the need for continued popular and international movements against the "systematic Zionist aggression, genocide, and starvation against over two million Palestinians in the Gaza Strip."

The movement emphasized the importance of intensifying demonstrations and sit-ins outside Israeli and American embassies, and those of states supporting the occupation worldwide. The goal is to halt Israeli aggression against civilians, especially children, women, and the sick.

Hamas stated that peoples' response to this call is "a fulfillment of the blood of the martyred leaders." It urged that this day become a continuous national, Arab, Islamic, and global movement, encompassing all forms of political, diplomatic, and popular pressure to end what it described as "the war of extermination and starvation" in the Gaza Strip. Several cities globally witnessed massive and angry demonstrations last week. These denounced Israel's starvation policy against Gaza's population and protested ongoing American support for the genocide waged by Tel Aviv against Palestinians in the Strip since October 7, 2023.

The Gaza Strip is currently experiencing one of the worst humanitarian catastrophes in history. Famine has spread due to a severe blockade imposed by Israel for over 10 months, intensified after the complete closure of crossings on March 2. This blockade has led to a widespread outbreak of severe malnutrition, particularly among children and the sick.

Deaths due to hunger have been recorded in various areas of the Strip, amidst hospitals' inability to provide medical care and the collapse of the health sector's infrastructure.

The war of extermination has resulted in over 204,000 Palestinian casualties, including killed and injured, mostly women and children. There are also over 14,000 missing, alongside widespread destruction and mass displacement of hundreds of thousands of residents. Hundreds of families have been deprived of the most basic necessities of life." Source: Email.



Stand with Me: Human Rights Violation at Rikers – Court Date Aug 27

"Dear Family, Friends, and Community, I write to you not just as DeMarisa SteeleySmith, but as a mother, a healer, and a daughter of the movement who now finds herself targeted for the very work of liberation. While working at Rikers Island, I endured a campaign of harassment and retaliation that no one should ever face. I was:

- Hyper-surveilled at every step, my movements watched and reported.
- Body shamed, with photos of my rear end circulated and sent to public entities, falsely labeled as "inappropriate dress."
- Forced to endure falsified trainings and documents that were weaponized against me.
- Given disproportionate assignments, while essential work materials were withheld to set me up for failure
- Mocked and humiliated at one point told to "bang on your chest to make music" a degrading attempt to strip me of dignity and professionalism.

To make matters worse, a supervisor openly and proudly called herself a "Karen" and weaponized that identity in her abuse of power. This is not simply mistreatment. It is a human rights violation, rooted in racism, sexism, and the toxic culture of incarceration. Now, the system is dragging me into court, trying to silence me and bury this abuse. Stand for Palestine and Gaza Every Weekday at the United Nations





Our interconnected struggles are planetary. To break the siege and end the genocide we must remake the world. The walls of the UN are hollow and these institutions are collapsing. Handala update: unlawful detention, stolen boat and aid cargo



"In yet another egregious abduction in international waters, a clear violation of international law, the beloved Handala was violently boarded and seized by the Israeli Occupation Forces just 40 nautical miles off the coast of Gaza. On shore, starving Palestinians eagerly awaited the arrival of desperately needed baby formula, other food, medicine, and prosthetics that were to be delivered by 21 peace activists from 10 countries.

When the ship was illegally seized in international waters, Freedom Flotilla participants were abducted and taken to Israel against their will. They were then forced into inhumane conditions where the women described unsanitary cells, extreme heat, lack of water as well as physical and verbal abuse. All those in the women's cells have been released with the exception of a 70 year-old Norwegian grandmother, left to face Israeli prison authorities on her own. Chris Smalls, a labour leader and activist from

the USA, was badly beaten and choked and, at the time of writing, has also not yet been released. In addition to these two, five other international volunteers remain in unlawful detention.

According to Adalah, the Legal Centre for Arab Minority Rights in Israel, supporting the participants, "Israel is handling the custody of the volunteers as though they had entered the country illegally—even though they were forcibly taken from international waters and brought into Israel against their will. The authorities presented them with two options: either agree to so-called "voluntary deportation," or remain in detention and

appear before a tribunal, to have their continued detention pending deportation reviewed." Adalah reiterates that the ongoing detention is illegal and unjustified. The conditions they endure highlight the harsh realities faced within Israeli Prison Service custody, where many Palestinians suffer far more severe mistreatment and abuse. The boat and all the aid on board were seized by the Israeli military and to the best of our knowledge never made it into Gaza. See all updates on Adalah's website.

"Our beloved friend, colleague, teacher, and coresister Awdah Hathaleen was shot dead by an Israeli settler last Monday while defending his community. The next day as mourners gathered to pray and grieve, soldiers arrived to disrupt proceedings, and threatened to dismantle the traditional mourning tent the village is using to host the bereaved and hold prayers.

Military raids have continued since then with 20 community residents detained, and the state of Israel is refusing to return Awdah's body for burial and are imposing conditions for its release, including limiting the funeral to 15 people, and requiring his funeral to be outside of Umm Il-Kheir. Awdah's wife Hanady and the women of Umm Il-Kheir initiated a

collective <u>hunger strike</u> last Thursday, and the residents of Umm Il-Kheir are calling for people around the world to host solidarity encampments and mourning tents in their communities as part of an emergency campaign demanding the release of Awdah's body and of his family being held in Ofer Prison.

Dear Friend and Fellow Freedom Fighter,

The Spirit of Mandela Coalition, following up on the October 2021 International Tribunal verdict finding the US Guilty of Genocide against Black, Brown, and Indigenous people (see full verdict HERE), is calling for the building of a new mass grassroots formation: The Peoples' Senate. The people need to govern and represent themselves in combating genocide and addressing their right to a just and humane existence. Our vision is for the Peoples' Senate, organized directly by our oppressed communities, to grow into a body which will serve that purpose.

Today our communities face the most egregious violations of our human rights since the civil rights and Black power movements of the 1960s and '70s. Conditions we are living under include random mass shootings, rightwing vigilante attacks, police violence and murder, environmental racism, the reassertion of "states rights" (the "right" of states to ignore basic human rights), and healthcare racism. The US government dangerously scapegoats immigrants; causes destabilization, extreme violence, bombing, and killing of Black, Brown, Indigenous, and poor people all over the globe – and spends billions of dollars to do it; and keeps hundreds of thousands of people living in homelessness and poverty in the US. Our communities are facing targeted attacks against voting rights, workers' rights, women's rights, and Indigenous Peoples' rights as right-wing elected officials and appointed judges roll back decades of hard-won battles for justice. While out-voting right-wing candidates during elections is important, voting alone will not be enough. We must organize to put more pressure on the system for major change.

The US Congress and Senate are representatives of the rich and powerful. They refuse to address the necessity for universal healthcare or a sound nationwide infrastructure providing access to clean water and other necessities. Corporations ignore and violate the needs of the planet while evading their fair share of taxes. US prisons are filled with Black, Brown, Indigenous, and poor people, many incarcerated for crimes they did not commit and/or serving sentences that far outweigh whatever criminal acts they may have committed. The oppressed national communities of Black, Brown, and Indigenous peoples all have political prisoners and prisoners of war incarcerated since the 1960s until today, who have fought for our liberation and are being held in prison unjustly or only released when near death. We want them all freed now!

Building our own Peoples' Senate will enable us to organize locally from a position of strength and connect local activists with others, in other parts of the country, who may be pursuing similar goals while electing "Senators" who are mandated to represent our interests and demands. A Peoples' Senate can fight for changes that protect and ensure our right to vote, our right to control our own bodies, our right to live free from discrimination as LGBTQ+ people, our rights to living wages and safe working conditions, our rights to sovereignty and dignity, and our rights to live free from state violence and abuse.
