Casey needs our support!

"Casey is a dedicated community educator, writer, distroist, and printer who has committed their life to struggles for liberation. A federal investigation by the FBI and several other law enforcement agencies resulted

in Casey's arrest in June 2024 for actions including burning a UCPD vehicle in response to UC Berkeley's treatment of student protestors for Palestine. On September 23, 2025, Casey was sentenced to nearly 20 years in prison followed by 15 years of close supervision and was ordered to pay over \$94,000 in restitution. As of October 4, 2025, Casey is located at FCI Mendota, but we expect them to be moved through several federal facilities before they reach their long term placement. Check the BOP Inmate Locator for Casey's current location before writing.

Just as Casey has persistently for years cared for, supported, and struggled alongside incarcerated comrades, we aim to replicate these actions in solidarity with Casey as they continue their struggle from the other side of the wall. A note from Casey in September 2025: "Thanks to everybody out there who has shown me love and offered support through this time. I wish every prisoner could experience the level of support you all have shown to me. In here, I've done my best to show my love to all my fellow prisoners and I remain steadfast to the movement to Palestinian liberation and the movements for decolonization and abolition worldwide." freecaseynow.noblogs.org

Update 10/7/25 from the Casey Support Committee

"We have few notes to share at the moment on Casey's present situation inside.

- We don't know yet if they have full access to commissary shopping but their financial account is functioning. Online transfers are going through and Casey now has some money on their books.
- Casey is in a segregation/holding cell at the moment since there is no dedicated transfer housing unit at Mendota FCI. They expect to be in there for 2 to 4 more weeks as their classification and placement process continues.
- They get 1 hour of out-of-cell time per day (which correspondingly also limits their access to a phone).
- Casey is back on an insulin regime for their diabetes after an initial 2 day hiatus during transfer.
- They have connected with family by phone and will also be having a legal call with their lawyers shortly.
- Casey is receiving mail.

Note: They receive scans of their mail and apparently the feds' scanning process trims an inch all way round the page so maintain at least a 1 inch margin so all of your message will reach Casey.

We'll share more updates as we get them. Love and struggle, Free Palestine, CSC."

Tributes to Beloved Mama Assata Shakur & Links to Carrying It On

"Resistance in Brooklyn (RnB), a 30+-year-old anti-imperialist collective, joins countless comrades in mourning the transition of the extraordinary Assata Olugbala Shakur. Yet we are also reflective about the fact that so many tributes are disconnected from the broad, embracing, militant and principled role model that Assata represents. It feels like more than an oversight when this outpouring of apparent grief at her passing fails to take note (and increase solidarity around) Queen Mother Assata's closest family, some of whom like Kamau Sadiki are still incarcerated political prisoners (who she never stopped championing at every opportunity), others of whom like Sundiata Acoli are elders (who she never stopped loving and who are still in need of our support). RnB is pleased, then, to collect and share these words, photos, and graphics, as our part of our continued love of Assata, and respect/inspiration for all that she stood for. Please note: scroll below for concrete information on supporting Kamau Sadiki and the movement to free him and all political prisoners.

We would encourage you to read all the way through. While some of the statements have been published elsewhere, others have not been at all or have not been widely circulated. We begin with the words, from Assata's highly articulate daughter, Kakuyu Shakur, that formally informed us of the news:

"At approximately 1:15 PM on September 25th, my mother, Assata Shakur, took her last earthly breath. Words cannot describe the depth of loss that I am feeling at this time. I want to thank you for your loving prayers that continue to anchor me in the strength that I need in this moment. My spirit is overflowing in unison with all of you who are grieving with me at this time.

Sending much love and appreciation to you all, Kakuya Shakur"

Next is a reflection from RnB's own **Matt Meyer,** who along with RnB co-founder **Meg Starr** got to meet with and interview Assata in 1992. Following Matt's tribute is a link to read that full interview, and another link to support the publication *Re-Build*, that keeps alive that interview and other key documents and ongoing news from the Black/New Afrikan liberation movement.

"Tonight, as my family and I join many throughout the world in saying our goodbyes to the earthly incarnation of Heroic Sister/Comrade Mama Assata Shakur, I am not feeling much sadness at all. If we know that the ancestors remain with us - more so when we remember them and pay homage to their histories - then I am picturing Sister Assata sharing hugs and smiles with her beloved Big Brother, Baba Sekou Odinga. If I'm sad at all, it's for those of us left behind, especially her daughter Kukuya. I am thinking of her co-defendant Sundiata Acoli, and the wonderful dequi kioni-sadiki, who i believe will both be joining many others tonight at the annual NYC Black Panther Film Festival. We can be sad for ourselves, but not for Sister Assata. What a life well-lived, defiantly on her own terms!! What a consistent, stalwart, articulate visionary!! Easily one of the greatest honors and privileges of my life was getting to sit with Sister Assata on three separate occasions, once for an interview that was published by Crossroads. People who follow my social media know that I've been able to meet with heads of state and presidents, with Nobel laureates and esteemed academics. In so many ways, Sister Assata was above all of them, and not just because of what she represented symbolically: the soul of the Black liberation movement. Assata was simply and genuinely that brilliant: deeply strategic and holistic, broadly internationalist and inclusive, fearlessly loving and militantly committed to the liberation of all people, especially peoples of African descent. If, in reflecting on her legacy, we work towards a mere fraction of that strategic, internationalist, revolutionary loving, liberationist spirit and practice, Sister Assata will live on in us. The world desperately needs this to be so. We have a duty to win. Matt Meyer."

Sister Thandisizwe Chimurenga, stalwart freedom fighter and revolutionary journalist based in Los Angeles, recently came out with two essential books: collections of interviews, transcribed conversations, and the like with an amazing array of women freedom fighters. Some of Us Are Brave: Interviews and Conversations with Sistas on Life, Art, and Struggle (Daraja Press, 2024) includes some words from Sister Assata, excerpted here, and a remembrance from Sister Thandi. Following Thandi's tribute is a link for those who wish to read more.

Assata Remembrance

"... I don't want to mention any names of organizations, but there [are] enough sisters around that if we ever get to tell our stories in the movement, it would be a very interesting project, in terms of a book or in terms of a film, because the experiences were devastating. They were devastating to many women, because a lot of women were serious about struggling [for Black Liberation] and then got into the struggle, got into a relationship, and were totally frustrated in their ability to struggle, because of personal resistance from their mates, from their organization, and had no backup."

These words from Mama Assata's conversation with members of the New Afrikan Women's TaskForce in 1993 stand out to me the most. We celebrate this woman for what she has contributed to and means for our movement and yet, during the same time period that she fought for our liberation, other Black women who wanted to do the same were thwarted. This is a stain that must be openly acknowledged and atoned for.

Assata Olugbala Shakur was our "Shining Black" Warrior Queen Mother. Our sister comrade. Our Mama. She loved us. She fought for us. She sacrificed for us. And her autobiography, infused with

poetry, showed us the beauty of a woman the state called a terrorist. She was a beautiful soul who said we must be weapons of "mass construction" creating more beauty in the world because the people currently running it are destroying it. She was devoted to us, her people. Love; Love of Black people, Sacrifice, Commitment and Beauty. That is who she was. And that is who she remains, forever free now.

Abbas Muntaqim penned the following longer piece, which we find important on several levels. It not only calls the names of "Assata's people" transitioned and still with us, it speaks poignantly to the world we need to build and live in today. We think of our dear Silvia Baraldini, of our Babas Jalil Munaqim (Abbas's uncle) and Jihad Abdulmumit, of Marilyn Buck and Mutulu Shakur, and always of Sekou Odinga and Sundiata Acoli. Let the R/evolutionary LOVE flow...

R/evolutionary Love: Remembering Assata Shakur and Her Comrades, Known and Unknown - Abbas Muntaqim

R/evolutionary love is a transformative energy that has the inertia capable of defeating goliaths multiple times over. It is a love that is a byproduct of love for God—which produces an unshakable faith capable of defeating armies of shaytans. When reflecting on Assata's life, she is a prime example of someone who embodied r/evolutionary love.

This is a love so deep that it can even reach the unknown valleys of the deep ocean. This type of love is not boxed in by the hollow enclaves of the material world, where individualism, egoism, and consumerism run supreme. Rather, it is a love that is transformed into the material world when spirits, souls, and hearts bond together in unison for a common love of God and the people He created. It was this type of love that broke the chains of the neo-slave system off of Assata and allowed her to be free. She evaded the noose of domestic colonialism due to the willingness of her comrades to make the sacrifices to get her out—sacrifices powered by such love. The Caribbean Sea, where many of our unknown ancestors became martyrs, merged with the strength of the Cuban Revolution, which refused to give her up. This produced an international revolutionary love that bound the hearts of New Afrikans to the Cuban people, where not even the depths of the ocean could stop the bonds of solidarity—and it allowed Assata to have refuge from the harpoon of imperialism.

Assata was a product of comrades. And comrades too are produced from revolutionary love. There can be no camaraderie without revolutionary love, as it is the basis that fills the foundation. Assata's life is not an individual one. To be a revolutionary is to accept that you, in reality, are no longer a single being. Rather, you accept that you are a part of a body that moves in harmony, connected by arteries of other revolutionaries.

Assata's life is one filled with people at various points showing her love and support. Do we think she said, "we must love and support one another" out of thin air? Or is this love and support she referenced one that she received—one that made Assata... Assata.

Assata was and is a product of her comrades. What made her great was her comrades. And she is who made her comrades great as well. She was able to breathe the sea-kissed air for decades because her comrades chose the stale air of prison—so that her skin could be kissed by the sun... while those who freed her, if they were lucky, would get an hour of sun a day, and the most constant light was the artificial one in a cell.

To honor Assata is to honor Sekou Odinga, her beloved New Afrikan Muslim comrade who she joins in the heavens. Assata—who took the name Shakur, which means "the thankful one" in Arabic—was too thankful for her brother Sekou, who allowed her to be free.

To remember her is to honor Mutulu, another member of the Shakur household, where the blood of camaraderie and the spirit of Islam built a beautiful family of revolutionaries.

To remember her is to remember Marilyn Buck and Silvia Baraldini, whose camaraderie extended past the racial line, showing our common humanity.

To remember her is to remember Martyr Mtayari Sundiata.

It is to remember the struggle of Winston Kokayi Patterson.

To remember her is to remember the unknown comrades, whose names we don't remember but whose spirit lives within us.

To remember Assata is to remember the current political prisoners of war who are still behind bars, like Kamau Sadiki, the father of her daughter Kakuya—who refused to give up information on Assata and is still paying the price for it.

To remember Assata is to remember the political prisoners of war who got their freedom and are still here with us—the likes of Jalil Muntaqim, Sundiata Acoli (who was on the turnpike with her in New Jersey), Jihad Abdulmumit, Ashanti Alston, and Dhoruba Bin Wahad. These are the comrades that made sacrifices, but where is their support? To remember Assata is to support the elders and veterans of the Black Liberation Movement!

But to remember Assata is not only to remember her comrades in the flesh and in the spiritual realm, it is to remember the principle: that none of us is free unless all of us are free.

It is to remember that love for Allah and for the people is not passive—it is active, sacrificial, egoless, and liberating. It is to remember that Assata's liberation was an embodiment of love for God and love for the oppressed. That her existence in Cuba in exile was not isolation, but a living testament to solidarity amongst oppressed people. Remembering Assata is to ensure that her name endures not as a relic of a revolutionary in the past, but as a living example of "we have nothing to lose but our chains."

Assata lives because revolutionary love lives. Martyrs live. Our ancestors' spirit lives
And revolutionary love lives only when we breathe life into it—through action, through sacrifice,
through refusing to abandon those who carried us. Through committing to the struggle no matter the
circumstances!

So when we call her name, let it not be a performance, nor a virtue signal. Let it not be only poetry. Let it be a commitment to oppressed people. Let it lead us to a pledge that we will not forget the political prisoners and political prisoners of war still held behind this Babylonian system. Let it be a pledge to support her comrades still struggling, and to make new comrades for the generations still to come.

To remember Assata is to make revolutionary love a lived practice of r/evolution, not a slogan. To remember Assata is to become comrades ourselves.

May Allah be pleased with our dear sister Assata and her comrades. May He have mercy on their souls.

Assata's New York Black Panther big brother **Dhoruba bin Wahad** has been an inspiration to many of us for many years. Working with Dhoruba shortly after his release, on the 1990 International Tribunal on Human Rights Violations of Political Prisoners and Prisoners of War and other pursuits, we learned of his deep internationalist analysis which continues to this day

He visited Assata around the time of that Tribunal, and posted photos from that visit just after her transition. Dhoruba's poetic tribute accompanied those photos, and follows:

"Haven't seen Assata since [the 1990s-era pics] in Cuba were taken after 19 years in captivity. It Seems like yesterday, but it was long ago. We laughed and remembered the secrets that we shared, behind Curtains drawn and lights turned way down low. Underground, we were running to live and living to Run, We were young and strong and We were Running Against the Wind...

Well I'm much Older Now, and should know better than to mourn your transition rather than organize... but Time has a way of making us all reconcile Our Future Past - we can do both at the same time. Revolutionaries don't just die and pass-away: when we shout their Name above the noise and clamor of the Whirlwind

...they Live!"

Finally, we end this series of Assata tributes with the inspiring statement of the **National Alumni Association of the Black Panther Party**. Our work with them in the Spirit of Mandela coalition, and on the upcoming National Mobilization Against Genocides to be held in Atlanta, Georgia on July 4th, 2026, continues to keep us focused on the work that still needs to be done.

"Carry It On! These three simple words are a majestic summation on the life of our Beloved comradesista Assata Olugbala Shakur, whose battle with declining health issues ended this past Thursday, September 25, 2025. She was 78 years-old.

Carry It On is how Assata Shakur lived her life! Assata carried on our Black Freedom-dreams with an abundance of Love, self-determination, creativity, honor, commitment, sacrifice, fortitude, courage, strength, intelligence, beauty, resilience and resistance.

The National Alumni Association of the Black Panther Party cherishes and honors the life of Assata Shakur not as an icon, but as a mother, daughter, sista, friend and comrade, a human being. A line from a poem written by one of her BPP/BLA POW comrades, Albert Nuh Washington (RIP) says, "who I am depends upon who you are." To those who know and Love Assata and the history/herstory of the Black Freedom Struggle, she is our 20th and 21st century Harriet Tubman. She shares a birthday with another Ancestral radically fierce Black womyn warrior, Ida B. Wells, a great journalist and antilynching champion, and we cherish that she was welcomed into the Ancestral realm on the same day our legendary Freedom Fighter Baba Herman Ferguson was 11 years before!

Assata will continue to live in the hearts, minds, Spirits and memories of her daughter, three grandchildren, numerous BPP/BLA comrades and nations of Freedom-Loving people around the world so long as we speak her name, Assata Olugbala Shakur.

Long Live Assata Shakur, 1947-2025



"On September 26, 2025, Black revolutionary Assata Shakur transitioned after leading a long and virtuous life of internationalist resistance. Samidoun Palestinian Prisoner Solidarity Network salutes Assata's living legacy and recognizes her lifelong struggle against global oppression as a practice to inspire countless generations to come.

Assata Shakur was the target of racist, counter-insurgent incarceration from 1973 to 1979 because of her work with the Black Panther Party and the Black Liberation

Army. For years from within prison walls, she fought false accusations while bearing the brunt of settler-colonial prison and police violence. After being shot twice by New Jersey State Police, <u>Assata testified</u> to being choked, beat, dragged, kicked, pulled by her hair, and cuffed by her ankles so tight that the handcuffs were inside her flesh. She received inadequate medical care and was imprisoned in a men's prison because of how "threatening" she was deemed to be by the state.

Writing of her own experience, Assata noted that political persecution and incarceration is "part and parcel of the [US] government's policy of eliminating political opponents by charging them with crimes and arresting them with no regard to the factual basis of such charges."

In 1979, a unit of the Black Liberation Army liberated Assata from prison and in 1984 she travelled to Cuba where she lived in exile until her recent passing. Living in exile in Cuba under the protection of the socialist Cuban government only further expanded Assata's analysis of anti-imperialism and the interconnectedness of global struggles for liberation. Assata was a true internationalist in every sense of the word, <u>describing Cuba</u> as "One of the Largest, Most Resistant and Most Courageous Palenques (Maroon Camps) That has ever existed on the Face of this Planet."

Since the FBI's commencement and alleged completion of COINTELPRO — the program that targeted Assata and other Black liberation activists between 1956 and 1971— little has changed in how the settler state attacks those who fight for the oppressed masses of the world. Assata Shakur is one of many people labelled as a so-called "terrorist" by the US and other Western and allied governments. "They wanted to portray her as a terrorist, something that was an injustice, a brutality, an infamous lie," President Fidel Castro once remarked about Assata. The FBI eventually classified her as the first woman on their Most Wanted Terrorists list. A few years later, the first woman Al-Qassam Brigades member Ahlam Al-Tamimi was added to this same list illustrating the joint struggle that the Palestinian and Black liberation movements share.

Much like the case of Assata and Ahlam, Palestinian resistance factions, the Axis of Resistance, and Palestinian solidarity organizations and individual activists across the globe are designated as "terrorist[s]" for siding with the masses of the world who oppose imperialism. Those of us who recognize prisons as a colonial tool for waging warfare against a subjugated people are particularly criminalized.

Assata's political work with the Black Panthers and the BLA specifically identified American police and prisons as racist and oppressive forces that must be eliminated. Her offerings of steadfastness remind us to continue to fight for and honour those still inside and those who have been martyred by the colonial prison system.

Free Mumia Abu-Jamal, Free Abdullah Barghouthi, Free Kamau Sadiki, Free Jakhi McCray, Free Malik Farrad Muhammad, Free Ahmad Sa'adat, Free Kojo Bomani Sababu, Free Casey Goonan, Free Imam Jamil Al-Amin, Free Elias Rodriguez, and Free Them All!

Long live Assata Shakur, Sekou Odinga, Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah, Sheikh Khader Adnan, Ed Poindexter, Ismail Haniyeh, Dr. Mutulu Shakur, Yahya Sinwar, and many more who have been martyred and/or have joined the ancestors.

A revolutionary freedom fighter, a political prisoner, a mother, a woman in exile— Assata Shakur's lifelong practice of militancy and sacrifice will continue to be aspirational to all who wish to see the day that imperialism receives its final blow.

Assata Shakur Documentary

"Assata: Exile since 1979 On May 2 1973, Black Panther activist Assata Olugbala Shakur (fsn) Joanne Deborah Chesimard, was pulled over by the New Jersey State Police, shot twice and then charged with murder of a police officer. Assata spent six and a half years in prison under brutal circumstances before escaping out of the maximum security wing of the Clinton Correctional Facility for Women in New Jersey in 1979 and moving to Cuba. Assata: In her own words My name is Assata ("she who struggles") Olugbala ("for the people") Shakur ("the thankful one"), and I am a 20th century escaped slave. Because of government persecution, I was left with no other choice than to flee from the political repression, racism and violence that dominate the US government's policy towards people of color. I am an ex political prisoner, and I have been living in exile in Cuba since 1984. I have been a political activist most of my life, and although the U.S. government has done everything in its power to criminalize me, I am not a criminal, nor have I ever been one. In the 1960s, I participated in various struggles: the black liberation movement, the student rights movement, and the movement to end the war in Vietnam. I joined the Black Panther Party. By 1969 the Black Panther Party had become the number one organization targeted by the FBI's COINTELPRO program. because the Black Panther Party demanded the total liberation of black people, J. Edgar Hoover called it "greatest threat to the internal security of the country" and vowed to destroy it and its leaders and activists." Video:



The murders took place during a turbulent period of rebellion on the Islands. The island was put under virtual martial law, and eventually five men: Ismail Ali, Warren (Aziz) Ballantine, Meral (Malik) Smith, Raphael (Kwesi) Joseph, and Hanif Shabazz Bey were apprehended and then charged

with the attack. All the men were known supporters of the Virgin Island independence movement. The five were charged after being subjected to vicious torture, in order to extract confessions. They were beaten, hung from their feet and necks from trees, subject to electric shocks with "cattle prods", had plastic bags tied over their heads and had water forced up their noses by the "defenders of the law." The judge (Warren Young) overlooking the case prior to being placed on the federal bench worked as Rockefeller's private attorney and even handled legal matters for the Fountain Valley Golf Course. Eventually, the five went to trial in what became known as the "Fountain Valley" murder trial. This was an obvious Kangaroo Court and a mockery of any sense of a fair trial. On August 13, 1973, each of the five men convicted and sentenced to eight (8) consecutive life terms. Today, Warren (Aziz) Ballantine, Meral (Malik) Smith, and Hanif Shabazz Bey are all confined in federal prisons. Ismail Ali was liberated to Cuba via an airplane hijacking in 1984. Raphael (Kwesi) Joseph was granted a pardon by the V.I. governor in 1992. Calls for Action: Political Prisoners

Shaka Shakur- Don't Let Prison Authorities Disrupt Our Movement!



"The following <u>action alert</u> was published by the Indianapolis Liberation Center on 01 October 2025."

Introduction

"In August 2025, Shaka A. Shakur was abruptly transferred from Buckingham Correctional Facility, which is just over 70 miles from Richmond, to River North Correctional Facility, which is located in the southwestern mountains 283 miles away from Virginia's capital. This isn't Shaka's first time at River North; he was transferred there from Green Rock Correctional Center on December 21, 2021. When he arrived

at River North Correctional Center, he was handcuffed from wrist to feat and wearing transport gear. Around seven prison guards took him into an off-camera area where they beat him while yelling racist slurs. Over four years later, his body still bears the marks of that hate crime.

Shaka should not have been transferred to River North. He currently has pending civil and criminal cases against the River North guards who attacked him. Michael Ryan Brinegar is the main defendant in the case. Not only does Brinegar still work at River North but he is the head of the Delta Building in which Shaka's cell is located. Since Friday, September 26, Shaka has been at the River North Medical Ward awaiting surgery for his knee. Throughout the entire time, he has been denied adequate food and basic provisions, video contact with his family, and his possessions, including legal paperwork in the case against Brinegar. Shaka's transfer, current conditions, and the most recent violation of VADOC policies and the law detailed below are clearly attempts to disrupt Shaka's life and interrupt the momentum growing around Shaka's case as well as the broader political prisoner movement of which he is a part.

It is no coincidence that Shaka was transferred to a mountainous region and placed in a cell overseen by a guard who attacked him just before the worldwide release of a new documentary about Shaka's case *and* an edited selection of Shaka's writings, *Manifestations of Thought: When the Dragon Comes* (1804 Books).

Brinegar Taunting Shaka and Violating Procedures & Laws

On Tuesday, September 30, Brinegar "visited" Shaka around 2:30 pm. He said he was there to deliver Shaka's possessions, which Brinegar stated Shaka's cellmate packed up. Shaka asked Brinegar, who was holding a sack, trash back, and a stack of papers, to see his items. At that point Brinegar circled back away from Shaka. Claiming he couldn't find a guard on post to deliver Shaka his items, he then told Shaka he would bring his items to the main property room. When Shaka requested an inventory list, Brinegar said Shaka would have to obtain one

from the property room. Since his transfer months ago, Shaka still has not received an inventory list. In other words, Brinegar was alone with Shaka's possessions—which, again, include confidential, legal paperwork in his cases against Brinegar—for up to five days. Act now to ensure Brinegar is reprimanded and all that all violations Shaka endured are thoroughly investigated and appropriately and immediately remedied.

Shaka is a great grandfather with Kidney disease and other medical conditions who has been in domestic exile hundreds of miles away from his family and community since 2018. He is a committed human-rights advocate. If this happened to anyone of us, I know that Shaka would be the first one to stand up and set things right. We owe it to him to do everything we can to get Shaka out of River North and ultimately back home! Take Action Now!" See https://www.shakashakur.org/river-north-abuse/

November 2, 2025

Prisoners for Palestine in the so-called United Kingdom announce a mass hunger strike: 'We have exhausted all other options.' Today, the first two Prisoners for Palestine — <u>Amu Gib and Qesser Zuhrah</u> — began refusing food, the first step in the rolling hunger strike.



Dozens of political prisoners in various prisons across Britain have announced their intention to begin a collective hunger strike on November 2nd, a date chosen for its historical significance: the anniversary of the 1917 Balfour Declaration, in which the British government expressed its official support for the Zionist project to colonise Palestine.

The action is being coordinated by the **Prisoners for Palestine** collective, with the support of **CAGE**International, and could become the largest hunger strike organised in British prisons since 1981, when ten Irish republican prisoners were martyred after 66 days on hunger strike in prisons in occupied Northern Ireland.

The prisoners denounce the British state for **criminalising solidarity with Palestine and protecting the interests of the arms companies that supply the Israeli regime**. For months, they have suffered punishment, isolation, censorship and aggression for their anti-colonial militancy and their commitment to the Palestinian resistance.

"We are imprisoned for trying to stop genocide"

Former political prisoners and spokespeople **Audrey Corno and Francesca Nadin**, both arrested for direct action against the facilities of **Elbit Systems**, Israel's leading arms company, delivered a letter to the British Home Office on 20 October on behalf of the **33 people imprisoned for trying to stop the genocide in Gaza**.

In that letter, the prisoners make **five clear and urgent demands**:

- 1. Immediate end to all censorship and restrictions on their correspondence and communications.
- 2. Immediate and unconditional release on bail.
- 3. Right to a fair and transparent trial.
- 4. Deproscription of Palestine Action.
- 5. Permanent closure of all Elbit Systems facilities in the United Kingdom.

'We have exhausted all other options,' said spokespeople for the group, who stress that their arrests are entirely politically motivated. In many cases, no formal charges have been presented and individuals remain detained under anti-terrorism legislation, a tool of repression increasingly used against activists and human rights defenders.

Some prisoners have been detained for **over a year without trial**, in degrading conditions and with severe restrictions on family visits, religious practice and communication with the outside world.

From arms factories to prison cells

The sabotage and disruption of **Elbit Systems** — an Israeli company that manufactures drones and weapons used in attacks on Gaza — has become a symbol of the direct action movement for Palestine. Since 2020, Palestine Action carried out numerous occupations of factories and distribution centres linked to the Zionist military complex.

Faced with popular pressure, the British state responded with a wave of arrests, house searches and legal proceedings that criminalise those who dare to publicly denounce the United Kingdom's complicity in war crimes in Palestine.

Prisons have thus become a **new front in the struggle**, where resistance continues in other forms. 'What began as a campaign to stop the production of weapons for genocide in Gaza has turned into a struggle for freedom within prisons,' explained one of the collective's lawyers.

"From Guantánamo to Gaza: the same repressive machinery"

Dr Asim Qureshi, Research Director at **CAGE International**, described the hunger strike as "the first of its kind in at least two decades" and a step which "brings into sharp focus the violence of the carceral system in the UK".

"From Guantánamo to Gaza, the infrastructure of authoritarian terror laws built to imprison, silence, and suppress action for Palestine and voices challenging wars and genocide must be dismantled. Prisoners are the beating heart of our movement for justice. We must honour their sacrifices and stand up to challenge the injustices they face."

>Allegations of systematic abuse include physical assault, prolonged isolation, confiscation of correspondence and reading material, denial of medical care, and restriction of access to the Quran. Faced with the failure of their appeals and institutional indifference, prisoners have decided to **resort to the last instrument of resistance left to them: their own bodies**.

The continuation of a long tradition of resistance

This new strike is part of a tradition of struggle that unites British and Palestinian prisoners. In early 2025, activist **Teuta 'T' Hoxha**, one of the Filton 24, went on a 28-day hunger strike that succeeded in **publicly exposing internal repression and forcing the restoration of basic rights** within Peterborough Prison.

Her action sparked a **wave of international solidarity**: political prisoners in the United States, such as **Casey Goonan** and **Malik Muhammad**, joined in a solidarity hunger strike, denouncing the global persecution of those who support Palestine.

"We know that this is not just about getting back a job or a privilege within prison," Hoxha said at the time, "but about asserting our dignity and rejecting the silence that the state tries to impose on us."

Their partial victory inspired dozens of comrades to plan broader collective action capable of **breaking isolation** and highlighting the link between internal repression and global colonialism.

Prison as a place of struggle

The Palestinian movement has turned imprisonment into a space for resistance. Throughout the Zionist occupation, thousands of Palestinian prisoners have resorted to collective hunger strikes, uniting their bodies in a common struggle against dehumanisation.

Similarly, Irish political prisoners, South African apartheid activists and Guantanamo prisoners have shown that the prisoner's body can become a political weapon when all other means of action have been taken away.

In the words of Palestinian leader Ahmad Sa'adat, secretary general of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine:

'From Ansar to Attica, from Lannemezan to Nafha, prison is not just a place of confinement, but a battlefield where the oppressed confront the oppressor.'

The hunger strike by prisoners for Palestine in the United Kingdom is part of that same tradition of dignity. It is an affirmation of life and humanity in the face of colonial and prison dehumanisation.

An urgent call for international solidarity

From Samidoun Palestinian Prisoner Solidarity Network, we call on **all organisations**, **movements and individuals in solidarity** to amplify the voices of those who are resisting behind the walls of British prisons today, **to put pressure on the authorities and to denounce the criminalisation of solidarity with Palestine**.

"After we are gone, what will you say you did? Were you with us in our struggle, or did you conform to the very system that led us to our deaths?" Irish martyr Patsy O'Hara during his hunger strike in 1981.

Today, those words resonate strongly from prisons in the United Kingdom to cells under occupation in Palestine.

Prisoners for Palestine challenge us all: their resistance holds up a mirror to our collective responsibility.

"Background: On October 7, Joseph "Shine White" Stewart was transferred from Foothills CI to Marion CI as punishment for his organizing efforts. Upon arrival, he was restrained, maced, tased on his face, and beaten by guards, sustaining injuries to his shoulder and ribs. This compounds existing injuries inflicted by guards at Foothills CI, for which he has been denied medical attention, in addition to ongoing medical neglect for preexisting chronic health conditions. In response, Shine began a hunger strike on October 11 and is getting weaker by the day. He is demanding to be transferred outside the jurisdiction of Western Regional Director, LaDonna Browning—who is responsible for this intensified repression—and to receive proper medical attention. USCPR: Free Legaa Kordia and all political prisoners

"For over seven months, the Trump administration has imprisoned 32-year-old Palestinian activist **Leqaa Kordia** in ICE detention in Texas. She has **lost over 170 family members** in Gaza, murdered during the genocide—which is ongoing as Israel has repeatedly broken the ceasefire and killed 100+ Palestinians only two days ago.¹ She protested at Columbia University during the student encampments in April 2024. But eleven months later, ICE officials lured her into a meeting in New Jersey in order to suddenly abduct her in retaliation.² This brave young woman, who had simply exercised her free speech rights after losing family to a genocide, was thrown into a cell with a bare mattress, left to wonder in bewilderment why she had been kidnapped and



"On Sept. 18, the U.S. Senate voted unanimously to create a "day of remembrance" for the racist, fascist agitator Charlie Kirk. The date they chose, Oct. 14, is also George Floyd's birthday.

This is a shocking choice. Charlie Kirk called George Floyd a "scumbag." By honoring Kirk on Floyd's birthday, the Senate is sending a clear message. It seems to be celebrating a man who spreads racist hate while ignoring the ongoing fight for justice that Floyd's death started. A call for a unified day of resistance on Oct. 14 has gone out in

response. The Senate's resolution "is not about honoring Charlie Kirk," organizers of the call charge. "It's about smothering a movement that refuses to die." **The real crisis: militarism at home and abroad-**The Senate's move is a deliberate attempt to co-opt a date and strengthen a reactionary agenda of white supremacy, anti-LGBTQ+ bigotry, and perpetual war. The goal is to divert public attention from critical issues, including:

- The ongoing genocide in Gaza.
- Escalating war plans against Venezuela.
- ICE raids, deportations, and the racist war on immigrant workers.
- The deployment of troops and federal agents in U.S. cities like Portland, Oregon; Washington, D.C.; Chicago; and Los Angeles.

The preparation for potential widespread martial law — a concern underscored by reports that President Donald Trump recently told generals to prepare for war on the streets of U.S. cities.

This domestic militarism is linked to a broader war on the working class. The corporate media, organizers state, would rather focus on Kirk than on the reality that more than 300,000 government workers have been fired, hundreds of thousands more are being robbed of their right to unionize, and people are losing access to health care, food assistance, and housing.

October 14 as a test

Against that backdrop, organizers are calling to reclaim Oct. 14 in Floyd's memory — with action, not applause lines. The ask is deliberately broad: If you can't join a march, hold a teach-in; if you can't host a forum, stage a banner drop; if you can't mobilize a crowd, hold a picket sign with your union, your community group, your neighbors. The measure of the day isn't scale but participation.

Suggested actions:

- Speak-outs at schools, transit hubs, and workplaces
- Rallies and marches
- Teach-ins and indoor forums
- Banner drops, art interventions, and vigils"







DID YOU KNOW that in 2021, the U.S was found GUILTY of five accounts of genocide against Black, Brown, and Indigenous people??

Dear Friend and Fellow Freedom Fighter,

The Spirit of Mandela Coalition, following up on the October 2021 International Tribunal verdict finding the US Guilty of Genocide against Black, Brown, and Indigenous people (see full verdict HERE), is calling for the building of a new mass grassroots formation: The Peoples' Senate. The people need to govern and represent themselves in combating genocide and addressing their right to a just and humane existence. Our vision is for the Peoples' Senate, organized directly by our oppressed communities, to grow into a body which will serve that purpose.

Today our communities face the most egregious violations of our human rights since the civil rights and Black power movements of the 1960s and '70s. Conditions we are living under include random mass shootings, rightwing vigilante attacks, police violence and murder, environmental racism, the reassertion of "states rights" (the "right" of states to ignore basic human rights), and healthcare racism. The US government dangerously scapegoats immigrants; causes destabilization, extreme violence, bombing, and killing of Black, Brown, Indigenous, and poor people all over the globe – and spends billions of dollars to do it; and keeps hundreds of thousands of people living in homelessness and poverty in the US. Our communities are facing targeted attacks against voting rights, workers' rights, women's rights, and Indigenous Peoples' rights as right-wing elected officials and appointed judges roll back decades of hard-won battles for justice. While out-voting right-wing candidates during elections is important, voting alone will not be enough. We must organize to put more pressure on the system for major change.

The US Congress and Senate are representatives of the rich and powerful. They refuse to address the necessity for universal healthcare or a sound nationwide infrastructure providing access to clean water and other necessities. Corporations ignore and violate the needs of the planet while evading their fair share of taxes. US prisons are filled with Black, Brown, Indigenous, and poor people, many incarcerated for crimes they did not commit and/or serving sentences that far outweigh whatever criminal acts they may have committed. The oppressed national communities of Black, Brown, and Indigenous peoples all have political prisoners and prisoners of war incarcerated since the 1960s until today, who have fought for our liberation and are being held in prison unjustly or only released when near death. We want them all freed now!

Building our own Peoples' Senate will enable us to organize locally from a position of strength and connect local activists with others, in other parts of the country, who may be pursuing similar goals while electing "Senators" who are mandated to represent our interests and demands. A Peoples' Senate can fight for changes that protect and ensure our right to vote, our right to control our own bodies, our right to live free from discrimination as LGBTQ+ people, our rights to living wages and safe working conditions, our rights to sovereignty and dignity, and our rights to live free from state violence and abuse.

We will present a series of webinar discussions about the Peoples' Senate followed by local and regional meetings to get input and guidance from a wide range of experiences for this organizing project.
